## Guest Speaker

**DG Peter Schaefer**

Apologies from wife.

Message from RI Chicago is the same as last few years.  
Membership, Polio, Foundation.

It is continually important to fight polio. Continued effort will be  
required even after polio is declared eradicated.

On amalgamation of Districts, the impact of Clubs will be  
negligible. At6 District level the opportunity to be involved may be  
slightly reduced.

It is an opportunity to re-invent the Rotary wheel. We could, for  
example, have a Regional Chairperson.

There will be a phased process of amalgamation from 1 July 2020  
aiming at a seamless transition. A number of programs have already  
been united.

Both current districts have the same end goal but their methods are  
vastly different. People with mediation skills will be important to  
make it work.

Our District has 44 clubs with 1160 Members and they have 49  
clubs with 1180 Members. Boundaries remain the same. One  
complication will be that we will need to work with child protection  
laws across SA, Vic, NT and NSW.

Rotary International is rationalizing the zones from 21 down to 17.  
Registrations are now live for the Conference. Encourage Members  
to give it a go. Expect it will be more vibrant with greater numbers.  
There will be some hands-on projects during the Conference  
including tree planting, mechanical hands, etc. Hoping there will be  
a media presence to see Rotary at Work.

The influx of 700 Rotarians will fill up Barossa accommodation.  
Chateau Tanunda will cater for 300 at one event.

Communications – Rotary Horizons allows the District to  
communicate to Clubs and Members but also for Members to write  
in as well. If doing great activities and want support this is a good  
medium. You can also see examples of projects going on.

RI Chicago has a new message, adding a 7<sup>th</sup> area of focus –  
Environment. Grants funding will be available for this. It is calling  
for 1 tree to be planted per Rotary Member. This would equate to  
1.5m around the world.

There is a concern from Rotoract Members that they are being  
treated like the children of Rotary. There is a need to improve our  
engagement.

Presenters at the Membership Conference are very powerful people  
who will enthuse you.

Rotary has changed and continues to change. Clubs are able to run  
meetings as they like, and there are some very different examples  
around. The culture of Rotary has remained stagnant while the  
community has changed. It is up to each Club to determine what is  
best for it.
