Business from previous Meeting

1. Equipment Maintenance

BBQ Trailer: Discussion regarding options for shelter, Roger C & DL to investigate pricing.

BBQ Van: Confirming pricing of Ratchet style jockey wheel (\$300 on eBay)

\$300 Single wheel solid, Northern Caravan. Moved to take to board G Nichols
2nd P Johns all agreed.

2. Trots Night: We still have prizes from last year.

Date has been changed (Foxtel) choice 3rd May, 24th May or 7th June. (Port v Solly night match 24th)

3rd May best choice, avoid football clash & 7th June is along weekend.

3. Mystery Murder Night: Fundraising event, potentially combined with a Schnitzel Night. Nothing further to report. Possibly mid-March confirming availability of the Virtus. Deferred.
