Club Assembly

International Committee

Projects – The Committee resolved to seek Board approval to apply for District Grants for:

- (1) Educational equipment to go to a school in Dau. Equipment would come from Donations In Kind. Costs include the cost of the container and freight. Rotary PP to pay full cost which would be 50% reimbursed by a District grant, if approved. Craig, John, Peter to follow up.
- (2) Shelter for an indigenous school in Dau. Indigenous schools lack shelter for assembly or play. Budget approx. \$4,000. Same reimbursement, if approved. John, Craig, Peter.

Walking Tractors Project – resolved to await Kuol's return.

Shelter Boxes – President Barry advised money will be coming in for batteries but will be going straight out for shelter boxes.

Potential Sister Club – Millau, France. PP Stephen Lynch is writing to that Club – await outcome.

Exchange Students – Discussion was held re there being no inbound or outbound students for the year ahead. This to stay on the agenda and the Committee will liaise with schools about November with the aim of getting the message to Year 9 students so that they would be in the position to apply while in Year 10. It will be need to be a whole of Club effort to attract potential hosts for students from overseas.

Centurion Club – Craig won the position after spirited bidding. He will receive monies from those paying weekly or intermittently.

Fundraising – John reported that the Community Lottery is not going well. He added that Port Pirie needs to advise Foundation what goal it would set for fundraising for Foundation. Resolved that it be \$5,000. This is a target that should be easily surpassed.

Silver Bowl – recommended that money from this be allocated to International to build up a bank for exchange students.

Footy Gates – resolved that this Committee proposes to the Board that no structures be built for the gates at Port Oval – we make do with umbrellas, etc.

2.4 Youth Camp, Barb is interested in having this run again. Committee needs to support this with practical ways.

2.5 Fundraising for Youth projects, it was agreed to look to hold the Quiz Night on 7th October. ACTION: Dannielle Questions for Quiz; PAM to check date with Golf Club.

2.6 Science and Engineering Challenge

ACTION: Pam to liaise with Bob over thank you letters, and writing to University of Newcastle re costs

ACTION: Roger Crouch to look at putting photos together for a presentation to club and also to use in seeking funding.

ACTION: Rob to send Pam last years District grants application for Science and Engineering Challenge and modify to submit for this year.

2.7 Southern Flinders Business Excellence Awards – Pride of Workmanship Awards

2.8 Membership
