Merrilyn Hewett Barunga Village

Merrilyn has lived in Port Broughton for many years and is the Director of Nursing at Barunga Village. The facility which is currently receiving a multi-million dollar upgrade takes care of the elderly, ranging from active fully mobile resident to dementia care.

Barunga Village is the largest employer in Port Broughton with over 120 staff.

The facility in three parts are :

- Barunga Homes – Residential Aged Care including Dementia
- Barunga by the Sea and Barunga Cottages – Retirement Living
- Barunga Community Care – Community Home Support

Barunga by the Sea on the Kadina road is for retirees and has a vibrant community centre with a fully equipped gym and an indoor heated swimming pool. The Cottages offer affordable rent and resident-funded accommodation for retirees. The cottages have two bedrooms and a private backyard with undercover parking.

Barunga Homes offers permanent residential care, specialised dementia care and day/overnight respite. There is 24 hour nursing assistance and care staff. The home has adopted the Butterfly Household model of care with many areas being converted to a more Homely appearance and offering sensory stimulus to the in-patients.

Barunga Community Care offers a range of services to people living around Port Broughton. These are services that are delivered to your own home and include personal care,, social support, meal preparation, shopping, medication support and even some light gardening. A private Fee for Service is also available for people that cannot or do not wish to use Government subsidised services.

Barunga Village encourages people living in Barunga Homes to maintain their independence whenever possible. Moving in to residential care should not mean your independence is diminished and often with appropriate support it can actually increase.

Merrilyn Hewett, Director of Nursing at Barunga Village said maintaining your independence is fundamental to maximising quality of life. “We encourage everyone living here to continue with their hobbies and we try our best to accommodate for this to occur.”
