Rtn. Rob Tolson Stayin' Alive

Rob, a paramedic, quoted information from Kings County in America where the survival rate from Cardiac Arrest got to an all time high of 62%. This compares to the rest of the United States where the rate can be less than 10%. They have intentionally done this by :

911 operators trained in communication CPR instructions

Public availability of Automated External Defibrillators.

CPR training for Local Residents.

Paramedics trained beyond normal standards.

Well trained emergency First Responders, including Police, and Fire Brigade.

Australian average survival rate is about 20%. There are 15,000 deaths Australia wide every year. Every minute of immediate intervention improves chance of survival by 10%.

Rob spoke about initiatives for Australia including delivery of defibrillators by drones once 000 is called and also a project called GoodSam. GoodSAM is a mobile app based tool to be rolled out in the future which will allow people who require assistance to locate a trained person in their neighbourhood.

CPR30 is a new initiative, providing a 30 minute training session to assist with intervention if you witness an event. Training is provided to groups like our club and then we could promote throughout the community using our network.

Port Pirie Regional council are considering providing defibrillators at strategic places around Port Pirie and surrounding towns. The units are fully automatic and tell you exactly what to do.
