### John Pirie Secondary School Interact Club

2 students made a video diary of their experience, Michelle Madden (not a morning person) and Renee Nikoloudi. It was a lighted hearted look at the struggle to make it to the 40 hour mark and how tired/drained they were towards the end "It really sucks not eating". The club raised \$1500.

This year the club will be doing regular visits to the local Nursing homes and trying to fundraise for a Me to We trip to India.

## **Club Committee**

Bocce and beach cricket as entertainment.

Club Risk Assessments- Need to proceed with the process. President Dannielle has obtained examples which can be used as templates. Noted that PP Graham was working on a checklist for the stage. While all aspects need to be addressed, primary concern lies with our temporary catering procedures. Pam has obtained guidelines from PPRC on necessary procedures, many of which we would struggle to meet. It was also noted in these guidelines that Health Officers may inspect at any time. Initially suggest we take up President Dannielle offer to have a meeting on Safe Food Handling, and then set up a checklist to be followed- with records kept for validation if required. Use the Club Picnic as a test run.

Club Meeting Venue- It was agreed that at the current time, the Golf Club was serving the purpose. If circumstances change, then we would need to consider other alternatives. The Port Football Clubrooms looks to be a good alternative, if necessary.

Membership- Some possibilities but agreed that we all need to do more to attract new members. We need to further develop the brand to make the club attractive to new, hopefully younger members. There is benefit from more projects which involve a large portion of members and which draw the club together- e.g. the Golf Day.
