### Not just Lip Service for the 4 Way Test

The Rotary Club of New York, New York, USA, regularly gave The 4- Way Test awards to business people who have exemplified high ethical behavior in their vocations.

## Niki Vincent Equal Opportunity

Niki is the South Australian Commissioner for Equal Opportunity. She has statutory powers to assess and conciliate complaints of discrimination and to inform the community about their rights and responsibilities under Equal Opportunity laws.

The Equal Opportunity Commission provides three main services in South Australia:

We provide information about equal opportunity (EO) in a range of publications and fact sheets and on our website. You can phone, call into our office or make an appointment to see us if you have an enquiry.

We provide education and training to individuals, organisations and businesses to create a better understanding of EO laws. This helps people understand how to prevent problems and respond to problems if they arise.

Our complaint handlers assist people to reach an agreement if a complaint of discrimination or harassment is made. We do not act as advocates. Our aim is to bring people together to try to resolve the complaint. If a complaint cannot be resolved, it may be referred to the South Australian Employment Tribunal.

What is discrimination?

*Discrimination* means noting the difference between things.

We discriminate every day when we make choices. For example, if you were buying a car, you would need to factor in your budget, the make and model of the car, and so on.

Discrimination is not always wrong but some discrimination is unfair and can be against the law. It is unlawful to discriminate against people because of their personal characteristics or because they belong to a certain group.

Equal opportunity is a positive way of describing the absence of discrimination. People are provided with equal opportunity if they are not discriminated against because of irrelevant characteristics.

When is discrimination against the law?

Discrimination is against the law when it:

1. is based on a personal characteristic
2. happens in an area of public life
3. causes loss or humiliation.

Discrimination can be *direct* or *indirect*. Indirect discrimination appears to be equal treatment but is unfair on certain people because of a particular personal characteristic.

For it to be unlawful, it must be also unreasonable.

**Example (direct discrimination)**

Gerry applied for a hotel management course. He was refused enrolment because at 46 he was considered "too old". Gerry could claim he was discriminated against by the course organisers because of his age.

**Example (indirect discrimination)**

A factory announced that workers with ten continuous years service would get a pay rise. More women than men had interrupted their service to have children, so fewer women got the rise. Female workers could claim they were indirectly discriminated against by the factory.

It is unlawful under the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 (SA), for anyone to be treated unfairly because of: age

association with a child

caring responsibilities

chosen gender

disability

marital or domestic partnership status

pregnancy

race

religious appearance or dress (in work or study)

sex

sexuality

spouse or partner's identity

The Act also makes unlawful sexual harassment and victimisation. It is also unlawful to treat people unfairly because they are whistleblowers.

Equal opportunity laws cover all workers. You are protected from unlawful discrimination whether you are full time, part time, casual, a contractor, on probation or a volunteer. There is a time limit to make a complaint. You have 12 months from the act of discrimination, sexual harassment or victimisation to lodge a complaint with the Equal Opportunity Commission.
