PP Neville Ferme

Neville came to Rotary through Rotaract and has been a member for over 30 years.

He was born in 1954 and is from a family with 1 brother and 2 sisters. He went to Wandearah Primary School and later to the now demolished Risdon Park Technical College.

In 1970 he left school for farming which included caws, pigs and sheep. In 1976 he bought a property in Narridy, did share farming in the 80's and in the 90's bought another property at Wanderah.

14 years ago he also purchased a property of 2,200 acres on the Eyre Peninsular near Port Neil. For the last 5 years he has been maily involved with services relating to hay contracting.

He has traveled extensively throughout Europe and Japan and visited many areas of history relating to WW II, including Hiroshima in Japan. Gallipoli and the history on the Bolshevik's are on his bucket list of things to do.

Neville has changed his name by deed poll. There was some mixup with his name on his birth certificate and his middle name of wier/weir was spelt incorrectly. He figured it best to make it right otherwise it would have cased problems with passports and official documents.

Besides his Rotary service, Neville has also been a member on many other committees and institutions including the Nelshaby Agricultural Bureau and the Drought Taskforce. He was also Chairman of the Agricultural Bureau of South Australia.
