Rotary International President

There are as many reasons to come to Rotary as there are Rotarians – maybe even a few more. But each of us has stayed in Rotary because it adds something to our own lives. Through Rotary, we are *Making a Difference* in the world; and the more involved we become, the more of a difference Rotary makes to each of us. Rotary challenges us to become better people: to become ambitious in the ways that matter, to strive for higher goals, and to incorporate Service Above Self into our daily lives.

What kind of difference Rotary clubs and individual Rotarians make through their service will always be their own decision. As an organization, we are guided by the three strategic priorities our Board has set in our strategic plan: to support and strengthen our clubs, to focus and increase our humanitarian service, and to enhance Rotary's public image and awareness.

In the year ahead, our clubs will have the support of a greatly augmented array of online tools, including a refreshed Rotary.org, a simplified Rotary Foundation grant application process, an improved My Rotary experience, and a rebuilt Rotary Club Central. As we look to strengthen our clubs, two specific challenges stand out in our membership: our gender balance and our average age. To keep our clubs strong, we need to build a membership that reflects the communities we serve and that will continue to develop knowledgeable leaders for generations to come.

Barry's Presidential Induction

New president Barry started by congratulating previous leadership of the Rotary Club of Port Pirie in developing a strong, cohesive and supportive club. Having only been in Rotary for a short number of years, he is very impressed with the historic achievements of the club by its past and current members.

In the coming 12 months, Barry emphasised the non-negotiables about continuing to have good fun and fellowship within the club. Being in Rotary should be, and is, an enjoyable experience.

Barry then talked about the more serious side to Rotary which also needs to be covered. Rotary provides the opportunity to offer care, commitment and contribution to our community to achieve effective outcomes. He is very excited about the 2017/18 Rotary International theme "Making a difference" and he sees this as providing a measuring stick for how we approach our Rotary commitments over the next year.

Barry's intention is for the club to continue to support the community in a continuation of its many projects such as community BBQ's, football gates, community directory and the Bowls night. His personal focus is on community resilience, particularly mental health and has had early talks with local service providers about how the Rotary Club of Port Pirie may be able to join in collaborative projects in this area.

Along similar lines is a desire to further develop our youth programs. Barry noted that planning for the Rotary Police Golf Day is well underway (to be held late September) with proceeds to go to the Breakfast Clubs of local schools to assist kids possibly from disadvantaged households by giving them some sustenance before they enter the classroom in the morning.

There will not be an exchange student attached to the club in 2017/18 but a new project for the International committee will be organising a Vocational Training Team from North Africa to come to Australia to study dryland farming systems. Our Rotary District 9500 has allocated US\$15,000 for this project which will be supplemented by a Global Grant from the Rotary Foundation of a further US\$15,000.

Barry emphasised the need to look for more fund-raising opportunities, and to further expand our membership base.

He looks forward to the year ahead and the support of members in continuing to achieve our Rotary goals. He was particularly praiseworthy of the experience and capabilities of the new board which was subsequently introduced to the assembled guests.
